Framework

- piloted in 2021/22
- volunteer-based
- extracurricular activity
- alumni powered (all presenters are alumni)
- all activities are strictly professional
- mirrors a typical medical student's career path (pre-clinical and clinical)
- 80% of events are dedicated to selfdevelopment-oriented activities (workshops)
- 20% to fun (motivational & professional cafés, career inn)

Goals

- facilitate the alumni tradition at UPMS
- collaborative approach between alumni and POTEntial alumni
- enhancing partnerships in education, research and social commitment
- lay foundations for lifelong connection between the graduates and the Alma Mater
- shift the focus from reconnection to building connections right from the start









JAP milestones

2021/22

- 7 events 4 workshops, motivational café, professional café, career inn
- main positive: high student interest (10% of total student population)
- limitation: designed to serve the widest possible audience, thus: restrategised/restructured to the specific training programmes of the medical faculty

2022/23

- 10 events 4 workshops and a specialty and destination café for all, 5 tailored workshops for pharmacists
- main positive: increasing student interest (12 % of total, 25% of Pharmacy)
- limitation: creating specific dental events remains challenging

- connecting students with our alumni globally, in scientific interaction
- to equip students with soft skills/career guidance to excel during their educational journey and beyond
