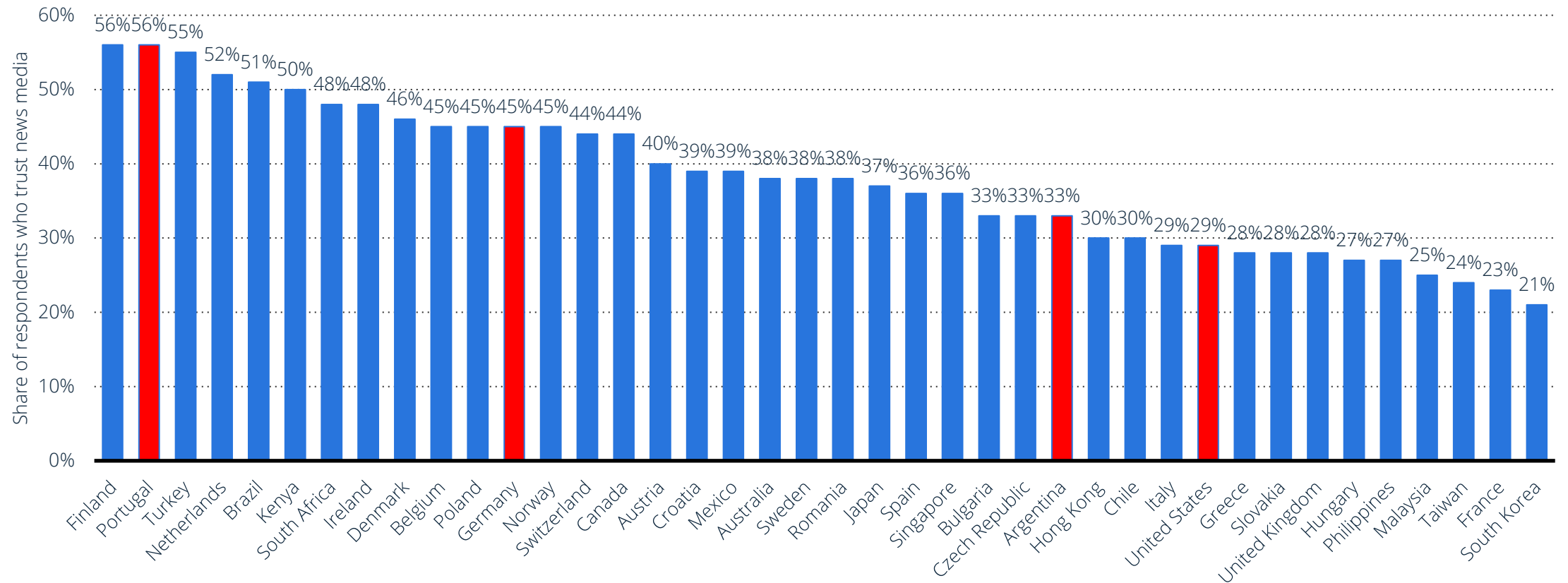

News Media and its reputation

- Major Problems

- Authorship

- Lack of confidence

- Unconfidence (disinformation?) seems established in media (legacy too)

News Agencies and fact-checking

- News agencies do fact-checking
 - Not all of them publicly
 - They have public blogs / sites
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- Associated Press – US and México
 - DPA (Deutsche Press Agentur) - Germany
 - Reuters News - Global
 - Télam - Argentina

 - Reuters News seems stopped on Feb-2020
- Content Analysis of their websites

News Agencies and fact-checking

- Not all of them indicates the source
- Télam stays it in most of their verified news
- Reuters is based on verifying videos
- AP they make written arguments
- DPA in some documents indicates the information change

News Agencies and fact-checking

- Not all agencies show the whole process but there is a pattern among them
 - Excerpt from textual news or show the picture
 - Facts
- Example from AP:
 - *“THE FACTS: No one voted using the identities of these deceased individuals, according to election officials in their respective counties....”*
- Explanation of the disinformation facts

Conclusions

- All of them analyse news differently and qualitative analysis seems better than other
- There is no guidance on what do they check and publish
- Télam educates is audiences through tools -> media literacy on site
- DPA indicates that images are verified starting form reverse news
- Future research → a more consistent dataset
